

City Front: Sail north under the Bay Bridge to Telegraph Hill, then cruise south to Candlestick Point. We make our way back along the shoreline, with close looks at Candlestick Point State Recreation Area, Bayview Hill, Hunters Point Naval Shipyard, India Basin and Heron's Head Park, Islais Creek and Pier 80, Pier 70, and Mission Bay.

Northern Shore: Revisit the early history of Yerba Buena Cove and Telegraph Hill, then explore Fisherman's Wharf, Aquatic Park, Fort Mason/Black Point, the former Panama-Pacific Exposition grounds in the Marina, passing Fort Point to go under the Golden Gate Bridge, and returning via a close encounter with Alcatraz.
